Fellowship and Financial Services Townhall Monday, May 5, 2014

FFS Overview:

- 1. Three Values of FFS, what the department strives for
 - a. **Context:** understanding the department and/or student perspective. Listening to their story.
 - b. **Consistency:** with policies, procedures, and meeting needs on a regular basis. They want all departments to get the same information every time.
 - c. **Collaboration:** this is joint governance; all departments and units are interconnected and rely on each other. Success depends on collaboration and communication.

2. Top Priority

a. Automation (moving all processes online). They hear time and time again that it is a top priority for the departments so they are moving towards automation. They do not have a timeline yet but they are working on it.

Questions from Grad Advisors (see powerpoint):

1. 2014-15 Fee Increase

a. An official announcement has not been made yet but they do not anticipate a fee increase. Health Insurance is expected to increase 14.16%. Official announcement will be made soon.

2. Publishing 2014-15 Fees

a. Grad Division will publish the new fee documents once the Registar's Office publishes the fees on their site.

3. Supplemental Allocations

a. There is no supplemental allocations as of yet but if they are able to offer more it will be announced in August.

4. GSRM rule; can't work over 25% or hold FLAS

a. The purpose of the GSRM financial support is to help those who are unsupported. Holding a position of FLAS is not unsupported. Plus, TAing while holding a GSRM is a lot of work.

- b. A lot of GSRM students are not submitting their final papers at the end. The belief is that the work takes away from their mentorship and research.
- c. Exceptions will be considered if working as a GSR in a related area or the FLAS is related to the research.
- 5. Intercampus exchange or Semester Courses not showing on study list, caused an issue for fee remissions.
 - a. FFS is working with Academic Services to find out which students are participating in Intercampus exchange prior to the unit audit for remissions.
 - b. Academic Services and the Registrar's Office are discussing solutions for showing semester courses on the study list.
- 6. International Student Recruitment Reimbursements
 - a. Departments may submit exceptions if they want to reimburse airfare for a student who travels from an international location to UCLA directly (since the manual states that GD will only reimburse from a US entry point to UCLA).
- 7. Over 25% Appointments while on fellowship
 - a. Grad Division approves about 80% of these now. It is important for Grad Division to confirm that the position will not affect the students' academic progress.
- 8. Special Reader Audits, can a department request a blanket exception to allow students to be special readers for undergraduate classes? A lot of graduate students are hired to work for classes they have not taken (either took something similar or have experience).
 - a. A blanket exception will not be allowed but FFS will work with a department if they want to submit one exception with a list of students for a given quarter.
- 9. Childbirth Accommodation Funding, a problem calculating how much the department is responsible for.

 - b. A calculation form will be posted on the GD site to help determine cost responsibility.
- 10. Will Jasmine remain operational
 - a. Yes, as of now Jasmine will be around for at least 2-3 more years.

 - a. For extramural fellowships that do not cover fees or pay only partial fees (i.e. NSF, other national organizations), the Graduate Division will cover 50% of the fees.
